Community Support Sought for East High School Entry Plaza Renovation

Buy a brick or a paver for East High School's new "Gateway to Learning" Entry Plaza project and you will become a lasting partner in upgrading the entrance to this venerable building at 16th and the Esplanade, across from City Park. The project is being spearheaded by Project Angel Pride, a non-profit group founded in 2003 to plan and implement improvements to the school's grounds.

Over the years, students, parents, alumni, faculty and neighbors of East, working under the umbrella of Project Angel Pride, have completed a wide-range of capital improvement projects. Project Angel Pride's current fundraising efforts have raised more than \$40,000.00 toward the eventual Entry Plaza renovation costs of approximately \$250,000.00. Design is complete and preliminary approvals from both the Landmark Commission and the Denver School Board are in hand. Construction is scheduled for the summer of 2010, provided that all project funds are raised by March 2010.

Now is the Time to Prune Street Trees

Entering its third decade, the CHUN Tree Project has helped facilitate the planting of thousands of street trees in Greater Capitol Hill, but the Project's care of our urban forest goes further. Pruning young trees to shape their growth to better suit our city environment is also an important task.

Surprising to some, Winter is the best time to prune street trees. Winter pruning saves the tree from expending energy putting leaves on branches that are later removed and results in a vigorous burst of growth in the spring.

Pruning is important to produce a tree that does not have branches too low to the ground. Remember, limbs do NOT move upward as a tree grows in height! A small branch 5 feet off the ground will, if not pruned, eventually become a big branch causing trouble for pedestrians and cars.

Pruning is also important for the health of the tree. The removal of double leaders, rubbing branches, and suckers helps promote a sturdy, long-lived tree. Removing a branch whose angle to the main trunk is too narrow will help the tree resist storm damage.

Tree pruning is not as intuitive as many people think. Improper pruning can invite disease and pests to invade the tree and can sometimes be worse than no pruning at all.

The National Arbor Day Foundation has published a short Bulletin entitled "How to Prune Young Shade Trees." It explains in detail how best to prune your street trees and should be consulted by every starting arborist. This Bulletin can be found on the Arbor Day Foundation's website at arborday.org (look for "Tree related publications") or you can obtain a copy from the CHUN office.

The CHUN Tree Project is looking for volunteers to help prune trees in our neighborhood located on the public right-of-way next to apartments, offices, and similar places where the Project has planted trees. Make Less Waste: Reduce, Reuse or Donate Large Items



We encourage residents to find alternative options to setting items out for collection.

Think about how you might be able to reuse, sell or donate unwanted items and reduce your trash volume.

Ideas on How to Give New Life to Old Items:

- ◆ Refurbish large items. Try putting a slipcover on a sofa or refinishing a table or dresser
- ◆ Hold a garage or yard sale and make a little extra money
- ◆ List your large items on websites such as craigslist.com or freecycle.org as "for sale" or as "free if picked up" Remember the saying, "One person's trash is another person's treasure"
- ◆ Contact nonprofit organizations such as Goodwill, The Salvation Army or other charities to find out if they will accept your household items for donation
- ◆ Organize a swap meet on your block or in your neighborhood (Swap meets are a great way to meet your neighbors)
- ◆ Check out the Denver Recycles' online Recycling Directory, which you may find at: (<http://www.denvergov.org/RecyclingDirectory/tabid/425356/Default.aspx>) for locations that reuse or recycle items, instead of disposing of them.

Don't be a Puffer!

Now that we are in the midst of the coldest weather of the year, it is time to remind drivers not to be "PUFFERS" (puffer - n. an automobile left unattended and running in cold weather). Every year, hundreds of people have their vehicles stolen while they are left running unattended.

The Denver Police Department is strongly encouraging the citizens of Denver not to become "Puffers". It does not matter if you lock your car doors while your vehicle warms-up; you are still a "Puffer". Many motorists believe that because they lock their car doors while the vehicle is running, they are not at risk of having their car stolen. This is not true. In the time that it takes to go in and out of your home or a store, a thief can break a car window and be gone with your vehicle. It only takes a matter of seconds, NOT minutes! Criminals prowl neighborhoods and businesses on cold days looking for exhaust from unoccupied vehicles.

In addition, be sure snow and ice are thoroughly removed from your windshield and windows before you drive. Remember, you can be issued a ticket if your car is left running unattended or if the driver's vision is obstructed.

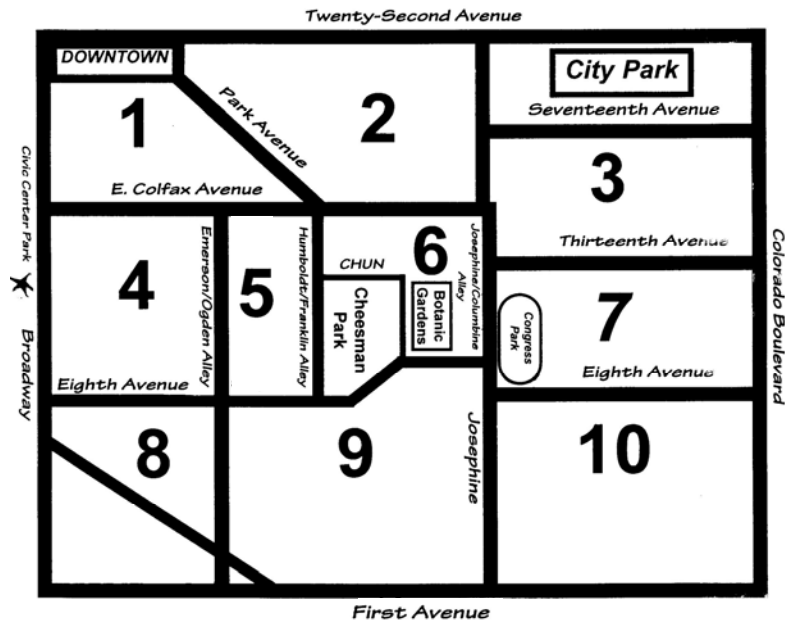
